### GOP chairmen appoint John Curran to fill vacant state senate seat

Downers Grove, Ill.—The Republican 41<sup>st</sup> Senate District Selection Committee announced today the appointment of John Curran to the Office of State Senator for the 41st Senate District of Illinois.

Downers Grove, Ill.—The 81<sup>st</sup> Representative District Committee, comprised of DuPage GOP Chairman Brian Krajewski and Will GOP Chairman Kathy Havel, announced today the appointment of David Olsen to the Office of State Representative for the 81st Legislative District of Illinois.
